

Nun Holds Office As Mayor

ST. LEO (UPI) Sister Lucy Faciane thinks she's the first nun in the nation to become a mayor, and the only one in the world right now.

Sister Lucy is dean of women at St. Leo College. She was selected mayor of St. Leo in January by her fellow town commission members. She has served on the commission since 1965.

"AS FAR as we can determine, I am the only nun in the United States who is or has ever been a mayor," she said Wednesday. "We have been researching the subject and it

looks like I may be the only nun in the world who is a mayor."

The women's dean at the Catholic-affiliated college of about 1,300 students said she decided to get into politics because she is interested in history and wanted to be "involved in contemporary history as much as possible."

"I have found people to be in great awe that a nun would have the nerve to try for such an office, much less win it" she said.
